- Google searches show MIT has distanced themselves from him, professors have made disparaging comments


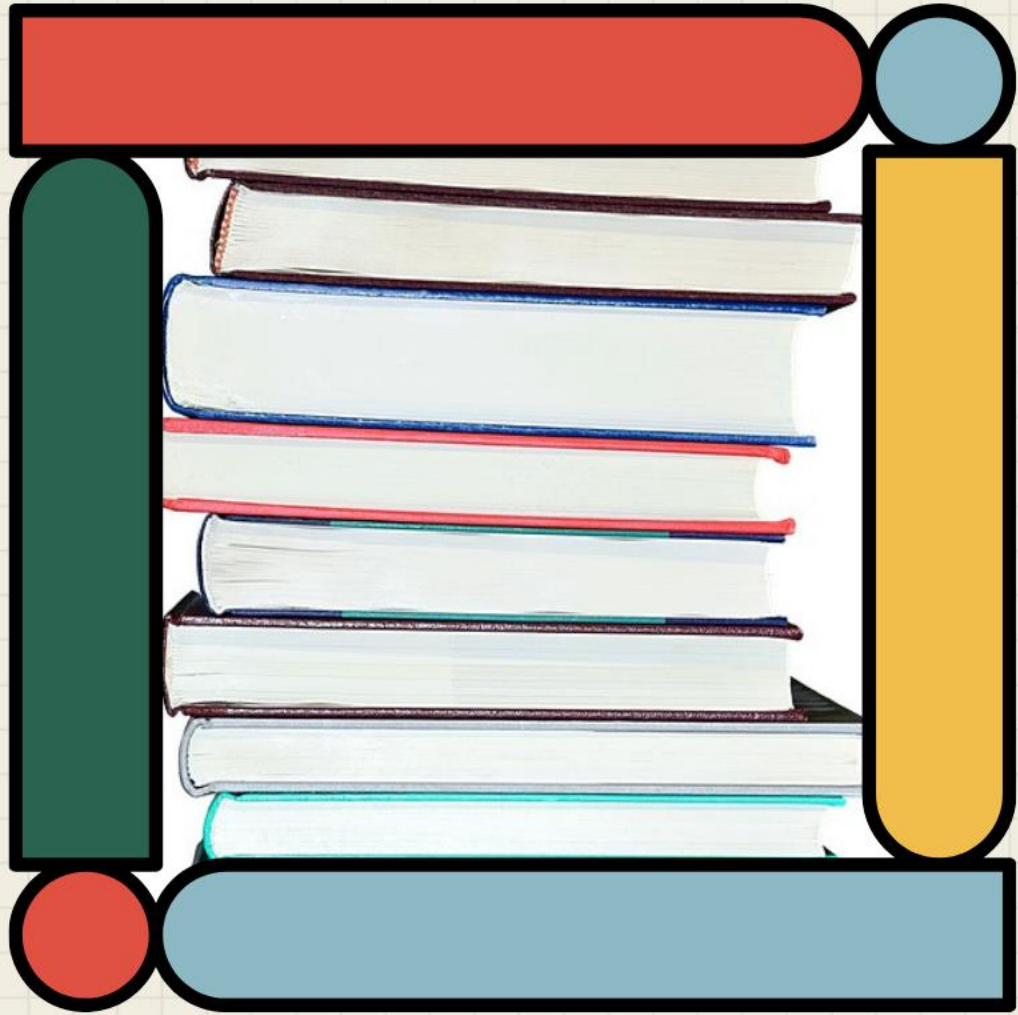

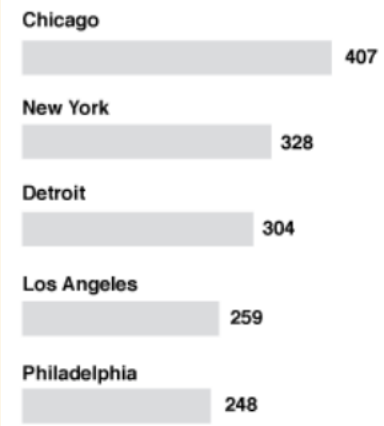

Total murders in 2014

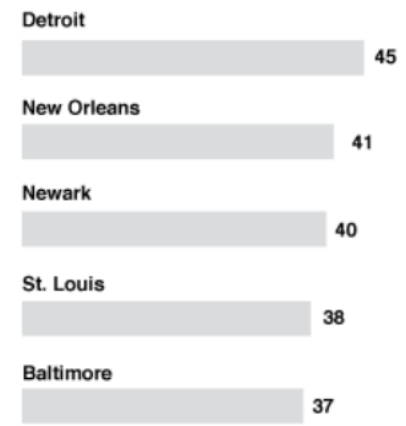

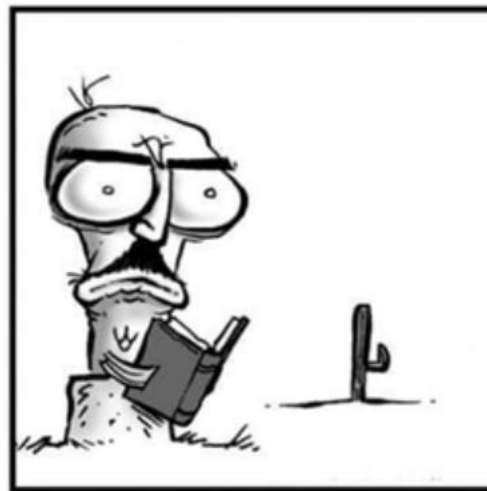

For example, this photo was used in a Ukrainian news story, allegedly showing Russian forces entering Ukraine in 2014. However, the photo was really an Associated Press photo of Russian forces taken in 2008 as they headed to the border with Georgia...not Ukraine.

Unfortunately, this and other misrepresented photos were actually used by a Senator in his attempt to introduce a bill in the US Senate! From the "Picture Prosecutor's." Other examples of misused photos are available on his blog.



 - Where did the image actually come from?
 - Is it appropriate to compare two sets of data?
 - Is it misleading?
 - Who wants me to believe this? Why?
